SIS NOTE RELATING TO BPD SEARCH RESULTS

1. As requested by the Tribunal, SIS has conducted searches for evidence of the conduct alleged to have been carried out using the search criteria as provided by the Tribunal.

Searches of the SIS Corporate Record

2. SIS searched its corporate records, against the search terms, for any conduct during the period from 1 March 2013 to January 2017. The searches in relation to conduct by SIS, relating to Privacy International, were accordingly carried out in relation to the period from 2 years and 3 months prior to the commencement of these proceedings (being 2 years prior to avowal of BPD in March 2015) up until January 2017. Searches in relation to conduct prior to March 2013 would have been, SIS considers, neither necessary to the issues in the proceedings (taking account of section 67(5) RIPA 2000) or proportionate.
